Minnesota Citizen Pruner Application for Temporary Inactive Status

Temporary Inactive Status allows Minnesota Citizen Pruners in good standing, to remain in the program, but be granted a leave up to two years with some conditions. Good Standing is defined by those who have completed the Core Course, passed the initial competency assessment, have at least one year of volunteer status, and passed the renewal competency assessment. While not encouraged, Temporary Inactive status allows for a major change in lifestyle, such as new additions to the family, an illness, loss of loved one or other circumstances that makes it unrealistic to fulfill volunteer and/or Commitment Renewal hours.

If Temporary Inactive status is approved, Minnesota Citizen Pruners may continue to volunteer, submit hours. If however during your Temporary Inactive status your Renewal lapses you will not be asked to not volunteer until you have completed your Renewal Competency Assessment. You may allow your Renewal to lapse during this time. If it has lapsed you will have one year to complete the Competency Assessment requirements after your return.

After the two years of Inactive Status, the Minnesota Citizen Pruner must return to full active status.

Requests for Temporary Inactive status will be accepted all year. Applications are reviewed by current program coordinators.
